



In his ministry of disciple making, Guillermo Monguía (pictured to the right) studied with and converted a young man named Laudino Cruz (pictured to the left). Little did Guillermo know at the time that this disciple and friend would become one of the leading evangelists of the gospel in Cuba and a teacher in the Cuba Bible Institute, an associate school of Sunset.

After realizing their need and desire for preparation in the word of God, both Laudino and Guillermo started their training classes in the entry level teaching program known as the seminar program. Unforeseen circumstances caused Guillermo to drop out midway through. Laudino, however, went on to graduate from the seminar program in 2007 and to complete his Bachelor of Biblical Studies five years later, in April 2012.

Upon his completion of that program, Laudino then entered Sunset's master's degree program in October 2012. At the same time, he became one of the teachers for the bachelor's degree program. Throughout his years of Bible and ministry training, Laudino put into practice all that he was learning. He continued his work as an evangelist in the Camagüey province, where he was instrumental in beginning several new congregations, one of which currently numbers over 100 members. Laudino has also recruited several men to participate in the seminar program and bachelor's degree program, including his former mentor and teacher, Guillermo.

Guillermo picked up where he left off and enrolled again in ministry training, recently graduating with a bachelor's degree. During his studies, one of his teachers was his former disciple, Laudino. So in this way, the circle was now complete: the teacher, Guillermo, became the student, and the student, Laudino, became the teacher. The Lord continues to work in the lives of these two men as they continue their partnership in the kingdom of God in the Camagüey province in Cuba (taken from Arthur Puente's report about his trip to Cuba).

October 30th, four men arrived in Havana, Cuba to help train 52 more gospel preachers. Arthur Puente, Kirk McAfee, Rudy Wray and Roberto Alvarez were teaching at three levels: seminar, bachelor's master's. The week culminated with the graduation of 20 with a bachelor's



degree in Bible. I was glad to be able to join them for the historic graduation ceremony. Next October, 12 will graduate with master's degrees. The following year 20 more will graduate from the seminar classes (6 basic courses in Bible and ministry.) This brings the number to well over 100 preachers who have been trained through this Sunset Ministry in Cuba. Because these men are well versed in scripture and very evangelistic, there are now well over 130 congregations in Cuba. We have now distributed 150 solar players in Cuba, including one given to each of the graduates. Pictured are the bachelor's degree graduates, their teachers and a Cuban official who attended the graduation.

Thanks to our generous brotherhood, the distribution of solar players continues unabated. The first two phases of delivery, primarily in African countries, have generated a demand for more players as our ministers are able to demonstrate the extensive teaching contained in these devices. We have continued to distribute English players; 430 players to 9 countries since March. Most of the distribution has been to African countries such as

Ghana, Kenya, Lesotho, Malawi, Nigeria and South Sudan. Other nations that have received English players are Korea, the Philippines, and Scotland. Distribution in Ethiopia of players with the Amharic language is ongoing with 52 players distributed since March. The demand is greater than what we can deliver because there are so few people traveling to Ethiopia. Our Phase III work has blessed many brothers and sisters in the Spanish-speaking world this summer.

By joining forces with various campaigns and with DiscipleTrips over the late spring and summer, we have been able to realize the delivery of hundreds of players to six different nations. Students at the school of preaching in Cuba received 130 more players, 114 players went to the Quito School of Biblical Studies. Christians in Mexico, Nicaragua, Guatemala, Honduras, Costa Rica, and Peru also received players. We are currently processing the rest of the Spanish players and are working hard to see that

these are distributed before the end of the year.

God has richly blessed this ministry as we have reached out to three language groups in the past three years. We look forward to what He will do as we continue to develop materials in Arabic, French and Telegu. Recent events in the Middle East have worked providentially to open doors to the Arabic-speaking world through the back door of Europe. This instilled in Sunset a sense of urgency that grows with each news report. The work in French has exciting potential because many African nations are French speaking and are hungry for the Word of God.

Our distribution of players has blessed people all over the world. The typical feedback we receive is, "Send MORE!" and "Thank You!" (Below: images of churches in Costa Rica and Honduras)



GERMANY'S MUSLIM REFUGEES

ver four million men, women and children have fled the fighting and chaos of the Middle East. Now they are trying to adapt to a new culture, a new life, and a new beginning in a strange land. Thankfully, congregations of the church of Christ across Europe are there to help. One example is the Lord's body in Bremen, Germany. The congregation began offering free language classes to help the refugees learn German. Once a week over 20 immigrants meet at the church building where the members help them learn a new language. Other days of the week, these same Christians are



available to help with documents, medical appointments, shopping and other day-to-day needs. In the process,

new friendships are being made and relationships are being built.

When the Bremen congregation wanted to do more, they invited Francis and Alfred Habashy from Cairo, Egypt, to work with the church and offer seminars on Christianity in the refugees' native Arabic language. The first outreach was in April 2017. Next, the church followed up with a second series of lessons in August. Doug Reeves had the privilege of being present for both seminars and witnessed something remarkable.

The first seminar was a general introduction to Christianity. The second meeting was more focused on their personal understanding. Alfred wrote three questions on a large pad. What does it mean that Jesus is the Son of God? Is the Bible reliable? Why did Jesus have to become like us?

Each night, Francis and Alfred shared the Word of God with 15–20 Muslim immigrants. On the final night Alfred asked the obvious question, "Who do

YOU say Jesus is?" To our amazement, the answer was virtually unanimous. They responded, "Jesus is the Son of God!"

These events have served to shatter many preconceived ideas on all sides. For the refugees it has been the first time they have met and have known Christians, and for the European Christians it has been the realization that many Muslims are open and receptive to learn about Jesus.

An incredible opportunity in human history is happening, and Sunset is there to assist, encourage and enhance the outreach of European congregations. One refugee said, "For a long time it was impossible for Christians to come to me, but *now God has brought me to you."* The question we must ask is, "What must we do in response?" Gospel Movement in Mozambique

od is moving in exciting ways in Mozambique. Tim Brumfield has been working there through frequent trips over the past few years. This year has seen substantial growth among the churches of Christ. The church has spread through entire districts with sometimes entire churches seeing the light of the Gospel. The church has faced adversity from legal challenges as well as from those that would use power to control churches for money. The leaders in the country have addressed and continue to address these challenges and continue to grow. In the past year, there have been thousands of baptisms. The challenge is to continue in the discipleship process. Tim is working to establish the Mozambique Bible Institute with qualified teachers from surrounding countries like Malawi. He has also helped to equip ministers to be self supporting by creating innovative ways for them to produce an income with a solar charging station, so they can minister to the small congregations that are struggling through a deadly drought.

Now it is time for me to assume a different



As you may know, we have for many years been involved with ministry training and outreach to Spanish speakers in the United States, Mexico, South and Central America, Cuba and Dominican Republic, including our recent distribution of over 2,000 Spanish-language solar players. We have recognized, as you undoubtedly have, a growing need for more resources to continue to evangelize and train preachers but also to help develop healthy local congregations with biblically equipped and appointed local church leaders. We believe that our Lord has brought Luis Melendez here at the right time to help address these growing needs.

Luis has joined Sunset and has already been on four deliveries of solar players across Central America. As he continues working with Sunset, he will be making equipping trips in Latin America to train preachers in a dozen branch schools and teaching in our network of thousands of students via live videoconferencing system. He will also be helping to revive and grow Spanish-speaking congregations in the United States by providing training in evangelism, leadership training and healthy church practices.

SUNSET RESPONDS TO DISASTER

Thank you to all who generously contributed toward the Hurricane Harvey Relief Fund that Sunset collected. Because of the loving efforts of a number of brothers and sisters, we have been able to send relief funds to the Westbury Church of Christ and to the Hidden Valley Church of Christ, both in Houston. In addition to funds that came through SIBI, the Sunset Church had a special relief contribution, which was sent to the Midway Church of Christ in Hitchcock, Texas. A few donors who called early on to ask how to help sent funds directly to one of these churches. Counting all that we know about, over \$70,000 has been sent through Sunset and SIBI to help hurting brethren in South Texas.

During Sunset's break week, a group of students volunteered their time with the North Bay Church of Christ in Portland, Texas. They were able to do work at a damaged trailer park and removed large amounts of debris. They also prayed with and ministered to the hurting in that community.

Sunset has also been actively involved in helping in Mexico City after the earthquake there. In addition to \$13,000 collected, an Adventures in Missions team has been actively working with Lalo Rocha ('09) and the Metropolitan Church of Christ to help provide relief.

Please continue to pray for the people of South Texas, along with others in Florida and the Caribbean, and for those in Mexico following the devastating earthquake and after-shocks.

After graduation in 1996, they moved to Meredosia where he was the pulpit preacher for eight years and still continued on a volunteer basis until his death.


Tab Brown ('81) died July 25, 2017.


Andrew E. Carr (Tentmakers '85), 94, of Levelland passed away on September 17, 2017, in Lubbock.

Victor graduated from Sunset in 1982 and then went on to graduate from Lubbock Christian University in 1989.

The last classes that Victor taught at Sunset had to be finished with substitute teachers. The students felt the loss of Victor as much as the faculty. Church History won't be the same without Victor's word pictures and hard tests. At his memorial service, several of the students remarked, "Class just won't be the same."

Victor took his job seriously at Sunset, but he took his position as minister of New Home Church of Christ even more seriously. New Home was family. New Home was where he served God's people. New Home was his heart. With Debbie and Wesley at his side and God as his leader, Victor kept the little church alive and strong.


