

Course Name: Why Men Do Not Lead Part 5

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Course description:

The final class involves the discussion of a specific plan to help congregations address the challenges of men who do not have the desire to lead. The insight gained over the last few weeks provides a foundation for today's discussion. The design of this class is to help men see how to overcome the reasons given for why men do not lead through a plan of action.

Course Objectives: By the end of this class students will have...

- A. Examined previous reasons why men do not lead.
- В. Developed a plan to help men overcome the lack of desire to lead.

Outline of the class:

- A. Today, we develop a plan by which we can overcome areas that have hindered men from leading in the Lord's church.
- B. Over the last few weeks, we have discussed 8 different areas that explain a few of the reasons why men do not lead.
 - 1. Lack of ability
 - 2. Fear
 - 3. Too busy
 - 4. Lack of experience
 - 5. Lazy
 - 6. Indecisive
 - 7. Pessimism
 - 8. Walk by sight
- C. The lesson today focuses on the development of a plan to overcome all of these reasons and any additional reasons that might surface. Make sure the class is divided into groups of 4 to 6 people.
 - 1. Ask each group to take 15-20 minutes to put together a list of ways the church can overcome the reasons we've discussed in previous weeks.
 - 2. After they have listed their answers, ask each group to share what they have discussed and make a list of the information on the whiteboard for further discussion.

- 3. A few areas that need to be considered, if they are not discussed by the groups, are listed below.
 - We need to pray for wisdom a.
 - b. Discuss the problems
 - Ask unqualified leaders to prepare themselves or step down c.
 - d. Provide a class designed to train men to lead
 - Appoint those who are qualified e.
 - Define the position well f.
 - Support current leaders g.
 - h. Focus on the positive and avoid the negative role of leadership
 - i. Keep communication open
 - Urge all to count the cost before accepting the responsibility j.
 - k. Always strive to improve proficiency
- D. Having listed out ways to address the reasons why men do not lead, and having laid out a plan for overcoming those reasons, consider the following steps.
 - 1. Select a committee of men to develop specific details for helping others overcome the reasons stated and stepping up to lead.
 - 2. Provide avenues for men to serve in a leadership capacity over specific programs or events within the congregation (VBS, organizing worship responsibilities, community outreach events, gospel meetings, etc.).
 - 3. Discuss ways elders can serve as mentors to these men in guiding their leadership development.
 - Develop a timeline for men to serve and consider their role in the 4. eldership.
 - 5. Mentor men during this period of time (a specific mentoring plan is discussed in future lessons).

Conclusion:

- The journey over the last several weeks has been one that revealed numerous Α. reasons why men do not lead. These reasons need to be addressed and overcome.
- B. The plan developed in today's lesson is one avenue for the congregation to approach the specifics of addressing these concerns and strengthening men in leadership roles.
- C. Spend time at the close of class to pray about what has been discussed and how the congregation can move forward in implementing the plan.
